

## **Episcopal High School Student Day Trips**

## **Authorization and General Release**

My son/daughter,\_\_\_\_\_\_, has my permission to attend group activities and trips sponsored by Episcopal High School. I understand that transportation may be by automobile, bus, or van driven by a responsible licensed adult—or on foot to nearby locations, accompanied by a responsible adult.

While I understand that some risks may be involved in such activities and trips, I want my child to participate in them without risk to Episcopal High School, its employees, and volunteers. To assure Episcopal High School that my child can participate in said activities and trips, I hereby certify that he/she is healthy and capable of doing so without risk of danger to himself/herself or others. I understand that it is my responsibility to withhold authorization of my child's participation in any activities or trips that he/she is not sufficiently healthy or mature enough to engage in.

Further, I do hereby release and discharge Episcopal High School, its employees, administrators, successors and assignees, and any persons selected by Episcopal High School to accompany my child (hereinafter referred to as "releasees") from all liability for any loss or damage, whether caused by the negligence of releasees or otherwise, and all actions, claims, demands, damages, costs, and expenses that in any way result from, or arise in connection with, the aforementioned group activities and trips. If a dispute over this agreement or any claim for damages arises, the participant (parent/guardian) agrees to resolve the matter through a mutually acceptable arbitration process.

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## **MEDICATION POLICY FOR DAY OR OVERNIGHT TRIPS**

Students who require prescription medications during the school day must have a prescription medication administration form on file with the clinic. These medications must be dispensed through the nurse unless given specific written permission from the physician and approved by Connie Thomas, RN/ School Nurse.

If a student requires medication during a field trip, day trip, or overnight school trip, the following procedures must be followed. All prescription medications must be listed on the permission form and also in the Magnus Health Record including:

Name of Medication Dose Method of administration Time to be taken Purpose of Medication

Students must carry only those medications with the number of doses needed during the time of the trip. Please send each medication in a properly labeled container inside a zip lock baggie with a note detailing the above information.

If the faculty/staff chaperone in charge needs to monitor the student to insure that the medication is taken, please alert the teacher by email at least 72 hours prior to the day of the trip.

Students carrying medications not listed or in appropriate containers may be considered in violation of the School's policies and subject to the consequences listed in the EHS Student Handbook.
